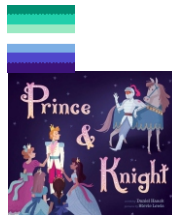

Four students who do not fit in at their small-town middle school decide to crate a third party for the student council elections to represent all students who have ever been called names



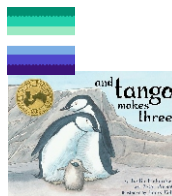
Prince and Knight

At New York City's Central Park Zoo, two male penguins fall in love and start a family by taking turns sitting on an abandoned egg until it hatches.



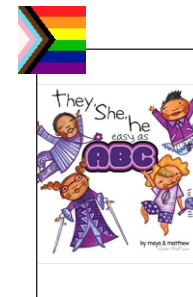
Harriet gets carried away

When a classmate insists a family must have a mother and father, Riley fears she will have to choose between Papa and Daddy until her fathers assure her that love makes a family.





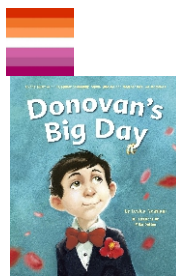
Stella brings the family

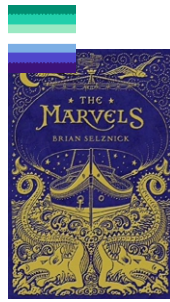
Donovan's big day

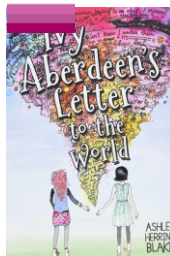
Magic Misfits: the second story
